

Introduction

Just as the popularity of "threshold Spaces" is a phenomenon that occurs when commercial society and urbanization reach a certain stage (Sfintes, 2012). It becomes important when it is a well-known place and people ignore their existence, constantly recording people's lives, and for them, they do not see their own "role".

The idea of a threshold space is a touchable but inaccessible space, where the most critical boundary value in people's lives is each person's emotions. For a scene, the scene they have never seen in their life is their own face, that is, the "Truman door" in the scene space.





At the beginning of the design, he rode his own bicycle to the East China Sea coast of the roundabout to carry out the corresponding research . There are a lot of leisure tourists on Bai Cheng Beach, Huang Chu Beach and Coconut Wind Village Beach, and all of them

Coconut Wind Village Beach, and all of them have developed the tourism industry, and all of them have adapted entertainment projects to attract tourists.

02// Site Element Extraction

Extracting from the site's sandy beaches the site's specificity, its susceptibility to deformation and undulation, allows for a visually varied design. The statue and lighthouse left on the site can provide a zoning of the area for viewing points and can amplify the culture of this place. The bunkers left on the beach can provide inspiration for the shape of the subsequent design.

The most important point is that

The distance between the two sites, the visual distance, provides the core concept of the project. Make use of this sense of distance, sight distance, and sight effect for the design.






Theoretical Background

Historically there was a close geographical relationship between Kinmen and Xiamen, with both serving as a gateway to the coastal areas and territorial seas of southern Fujian. In addition to their geographical relationship, Kinmen and Xiamen possess a shared political, social, and cultural history. (Tsai and Chiang, 2014:69-77)Both sides need an additional medium for communication, both in terms of distance and transport, and they need another procedure, which may be the "threshold". When I thought about how to present this relationship, I combined two theories for visualisation, one is Sigmund Freud's phenomenological theory; the other is Husserl's psychoanalytic theory.

001 EXPLANATION

- 01//Psychology Sigmund postulates that people who are able to bring this conflict into consciousness through free association are inherently selfcentred. (Jay, 2024) It was thought that the design theme could be put into the people themselves who visit this venue, adding some venues to make people's participation heavier, or designing a space where people can meditate so that their own ideas can be better dispersed, and think of more possibilities in a historically familiar venue.
- 02//Husserl argued that the objectification of science produced a problematic subjectivity, which in turn created a need for psychology. (Vos, 2012) This makes me wonder if people moving between two places may have huge thoughts about the other side of the world and therefore need to be provided with a space to think and vent.





The stories and relationships between the two places are all about generating change in political history, and all about the people involved. Thus both are reacting to the thoughts of people at various stages.

Can see the importance of the sense of space to bring people, different positions, before and after the feeling of bringing people and distance orientation is different.


Forming a semi-circle with mirrors enables the entire surroundings to be reflected on a single plane, giving an immersive feel.

With translucent glass, you can see the scene behind the mirror as well as reflect the scene in front of it, and you can integrate your surroundings to complete the impossibility.


The use of mirrors integrates the building into its environment without breaking the sense of order and phenomena of nature.


D3 THE SPECIFICITY OF "ONE COUNTRY, TWO SYSTEMS" BEACHES








Design Process

Design elements are found in the elements of the site, special memories and specific points on the site are preserved, and new imprints are added to form the design of the coast.







The design of the three sea architecture, respectively, because there is not enough time to come here to browse can choose this platform to experience; one is through the background of the eight big words, facing the other side of the eight big words, presenting a view of the building. The third corridor makes use of the traditional folklore of Fujian where A-Ma-Zu and the king-sending boat will be burnt in the vicinity, to recall the scene and make use of the elements of the bunkers preserved on the beach to construct.



CORRIDOR 1

THIS BUILDING IS ONE OF THE EASIEST TO REACH FROM THE MAIN TRAFFIC ROUTES, SO IT IS MAINLY FOR VIEWING AND GENERAL SIGHTSEEING. THIS BUILDING MAKES USE OF THE CONCEPT OF TRIANGLES, WHICH ARE STRUCTURALLY STABLE AND SYMBOLISE THE STABLE AND KIMBON. DECONSTRUCTIVISM WILL BE USED TO ELEVATE THE SPACE. USING THE GAPS IN THE SPACE TO CREATE A SENSE OF BOUNDARY IN A STABLE AND SOLID MOOD.



CORRIDOR 3

THE FORM OF THIS BUILDING IS LIKENED TO THAT OF A RADIO LOUDSPEAKER. IT REFLECTS THE TOOLS USED IN THE PAST TO SUMMON THE OTHER SIDE OF THE RIVER AND FURTHER DEEPENS THE CONNECTION BETWEEN THE TWO PLACES. AS THE SITE IS NEXT TO THE A-MA STATUE, THE STRUCTURE HERE IS HISTORICALLY ORIENTATED. PRESENTING PHOTOGRAPHS AND AUDIO THAT REFLECT THE HISTORICAL IMPORTANCE OF BOTH SIDES OF THE RIVER, AND CREATING A MORE. ATMOSPHERIC SPACE FOR IMMERSION. THE OVERALL PICTURE FRAME FRAMING IS RETAINED.













Designing the entire site as a complete journey, the flow is made into a sublimated tone of the design concept.


This design reflects the embodiment of the emotional thresholds of both sides of the border, breaking and better integration.




The five senses were used to express the design.



Use the sunken lounge area as a guided entrance to touch the building, adding interaction with people who can go and turn the mirrors to achieve a fusion of scenes. The idea of concentric circles is that with mirrors it is possible to reflect on oneself, as well as a boundary between nature and architecture, and also a boundary between one's own emotions and reality. And that put into this environment can reflect One Country, Two Systems, Unification of China and Kinmen Island, which are able to be on the same plane, forming a boundary to break.





Conclusion and Reflection

This series of process also pushed me to always keep my thinking clear and logical, and the cause and effect must be consistent. When doing a design project that gives a proposition, you need to start from what it is, figure out what the proposition means, that is, what we did in the first stage of the zine, and find your own "threshold". Then go deeper, the threshold from what aspects can be reflected, how to be more localised, this time you need to consult a lot of literature, as well as personal research, repeated combination of the two so that the results are reliable, this is what we call first-hand research.

Later, we began to complete the "book" exercise, from the authoritative principles, to find how to express the design concept of the means, so as to stand after the completion of the corresponding design concept output, after repeated experiments with handmade models, and sketches of countless drawings, and finally strive to come out of the design is the most convincing one.

This assignment not only familiarised me with the process of completing an entire project, but also made me think deeply about "thresholds".

From a word I hadn't heard of in the beginning to the completion of the corresponding design proposal, from the initial belief that "threshold" was only a spiritual meaning to the fact that it can be embodied in humanities, architecture, landscapes, and even history, it's an amazing experience since it has so many meanings.

It inspired me to start from the surrounding environment whether it is design or anything else, and this environment is not limited to the natural world, but may be the economy, culture, politics, history, etc. I need to have a macroscopic vision to find out the appropriateness of the design, so as to solve the people's problems, serve the people and adapt to the people.

So far, is considered to have completed this stage of my journey, deep insights, prompting me to more knowledge to produce the desire to explore, very thankful for all this happened, as if the threshold, the four years of learning life and now at this moment is like a chasm, no four years there is no present, and how to talk about the future?

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
