While searching through a row of abandoned case cabinets, a transparent evidence bag without an archive number suddenly fell onto the floor.

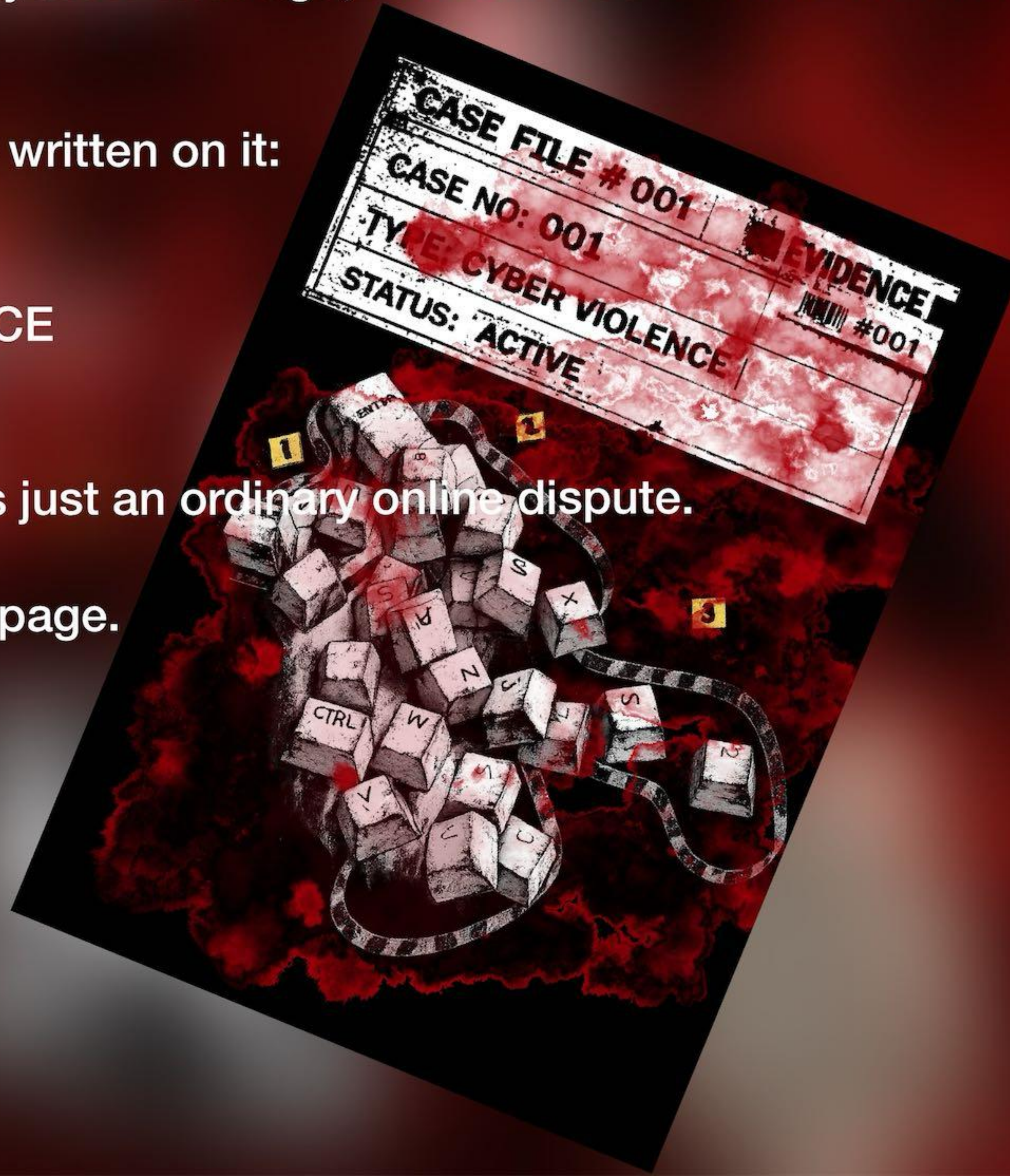
The plastic had turned yellow with age, and dark red stains remained along the edge of the seal.

Caller: I don't know anymore.

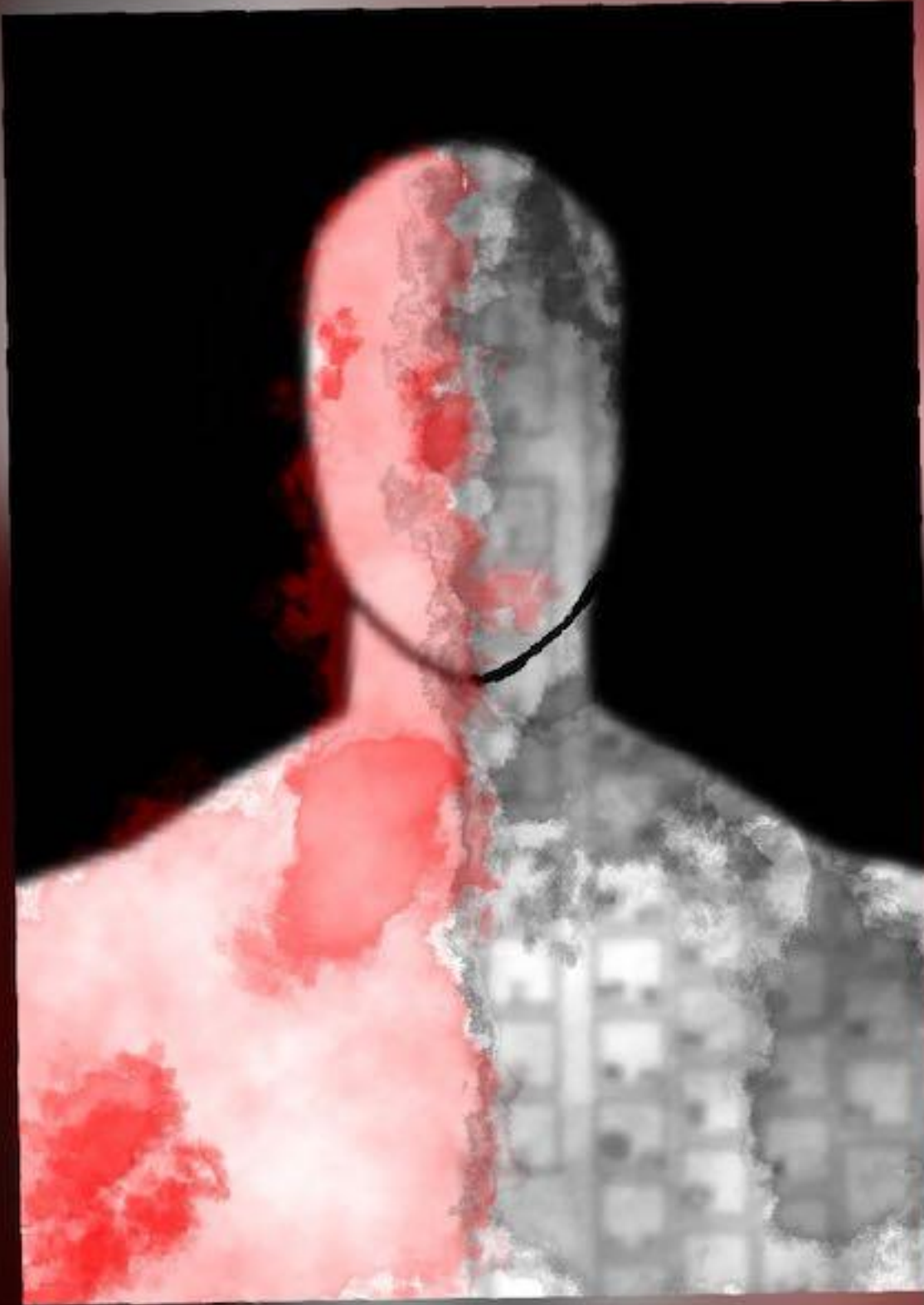
Caller: They found it already.

【Victim Information】

Name: Unknown
Gender: Unknown
Age: 21

【Preliminary Cause of Death Report】

Police discovered clear signs of prolonged psychological distress at the scene.

The victim had been subjected to sustained cyber violence, doxxing, and continuous verbal harassment online. The mobile device contained large amounts of abusive messages, threats, and self-harm encouragement.

No obvious signs of physical struggle were found at the scene.

The preliminary forensic report stated:

The victim suffered severe psychological pressure, anxiety, and emotional collapse caused by long-term online harassment, ultimately resulting in self-inflicted death.

【Case Notes】

Online attacks related to the case are still spreading. Several anonymous accounts remain unidentified.

03:40 Derogatory memes spread widely.
03:50 Attacks become personal rather than situational.

04:00 Abusive private messages increase significantly.
04:10 Users begin speculating about real identity.
04:20 The username is repeatedly shared.
04:30 The victim deletes some comments.
04:40 Deletion is interpreted as guilt.
04:50 Hostility escalates further.

05:00 The comment section loses normal discussion.
05:10 Commands and insults appear more frequently.
05:20 Some users begin provoking others.
05:30 New accounts are created solely to attack.
05:40 A form of "online trial" emerges.
05:50 The victim becomes silent.

06:00 Morning arrives, but the attacks continue.
06:10 New viewers join without knowing the full story.
06:20 Misinformation continues to spread.
06:30 Rumours begin to form.
06:40 "Neutral" voices subtly reinforce pressure.
06:50 The tone becomes sharper and more hostile.

07:00 More users encounter the post before work or school.
07:10 The topic gains visibility.
07:20 Friends begin notifying the victim.
07:30 Reposts include additional insults.
07:40 Mockery evolves into collective attack.
07:50 Negative keywords become repetitive.

08:00 The incident spreads into wider networks.
08:10 Discussions drift away from the truth.
08:20 Past content is examined and exposed.
08:30 Misinterpretations are treated as evidence.
08:40 Repetitive abuse dominates the comments.
08:50 Attempts at doxxing begin.

09:00 The victim's emotional state declines.
09:10 Notifications keep appearing constantly.
09:20 Every interaction is negative.
09:30 Abuse spreads from comments to direct messages.
09:40 People around the victim notice something is wrong.
09:50 The victim feels intense discomfort.

10:00 The topic continues to trend.
10:10 Bystanders turn the situation into a joke.
10:20 Mockery is remixed and recreated.
10:30 More manipulated screenshots circulate.
10:40 The original context is completely lost.
10:50 Public discourse becomes uncontrollable.

11:00 The number of attackers keeps increasing.
11:10 Personal traits and identity are targeted.
11:20 The comment section becomes visually overwhelming.
11:30 Rational voices are drowned out.
11:40 The victim tries to log off.
11:50 But the spread continues without pause.
