

I've tried different color combinations of blue and gray, and I've also tried typography to make people more aware of the seriousness of online violence.


How do you see your project evolving in the future?

Cyberbullying Research

Surveys and Questionnaires:

I researched the data of 100 people, including classmates, family members, friends, and neighbors, although there were some challenges and limitations in the process. I asked a few different questions: "Have you experienced online violence?" "Do you have any friends who have experienced online violence?" "How many boys and girls are involved in online violence?"

The data from the survey shows the prevalence and severity of cyberbullying. The rapid development of digital platforms, the nature of cyberbullying requires constant research to adapt to new technologies to reduce bullying.



I need to develop a holistic approach to mitigating the harms of online violence, which is crucial. It can help people who are being cyberbullied.

Celebrity cyberbullying incidents.

In terms of cyberbullying victimhood, being cyberbullies itself has an extremely unprotected. Sulli, born in Busan, South Korea, is a South Korean singer, actress and presenter. Due to her outstanding looks, 10-year-old Choi Shirley has already debuted as a child star of the South Korean SM Entertainment Company. She used to be a very famous acting idol. The photos of Sulli that she posted on social media without underwear stirred up public opinion, and people in most parts of Asia used this as a necessity to cover their shame. Many netizens said that it was their freedom not to wear them themselves. But she can't advise her fans not to wear it. Her fans are usually not very old and their personal awareness is not yet fully formed, so many netizens will judge and insult her. She once had a live broadcast where she wore pajamas and blow-dried her hair, and the netizens scolded Sulli on the live broadcast, Sulli didn't speak much during the whole process, and she cried during the live broadcast. The netizens scolded from the Korean internet to the hot search in Asia. She barely survived the scolding and before committing suicide, she said on the broadcast, "I feel like a lot of people are just putting colored glasses on me, so I'm still sad." "What a wonderful Sulli, who eventually took her own life through cyberbullying and depression.

Well-designed visuals can break down complex information into easy-to-understand, illustrated stories that educate people about the harm cyberbullying can cause. Graphic design rejects cyberbullying, improving people's understanding and ability to respond. Starting with an infographic showing statistics on the impact of cyberbullying, anti-cyberbullying measures are applied concretely, including educating people and designing content on social media. Areas where the effectiveness of anti-cyberbullying measures can be further improved. Raise awareness of cyberbullying and create a safer and more inclusive online environment.



Nearly half of U.S. teens have been bullied or harassed online, with physical appearance being seen as a relatively common reason why. Older teen girls are especially likely to report being targeted by online abuse overall and because of their appearance.

analysis shows that more than 97% of adolescents in the United States have some form of access to the Internet and that approximately 46% of adolescents have experienced cyberbullying at least once in their lifetime. Age and gender are related to teens' cyberbullying experiences, with older teen girls being especially likely to face this abuse.

Interviews:

If you are hurt by the words of the Internet, how should you protect yourself?

You need to keep yourself calm and not let your emotions get in the way, and avoid impulsive behavior when you're emotional. When words are hurting you, stop reading or watching them. Share your feelings with a trusted friend, family member, or professional for emotional support and comfort.

Counseling or psychotherapy can be sought. Report inappropriate comments.

What do I need to do to help people overcome cyberbullying?

More activities aimed at cyber violence should be carried out to convey the definition, impact and solutions of cyber violence to the people, so as to raise public awareness and cognition. Encourage people to establish positive and supportive modes of online interaction, and promote an online culture of respect, tolerance and friendliness.

Provide psychological support services, establish a psychological support service mechanism for victims of online violence, and provide victims with emotional support, psychological counseling and rehabilitation services.

Strengthen legal protection, improve relevant laws and regulations, strengthen the crackdown on and punishment of cyber violence, and safeguard the legitimate rights and interests of citizens and social order.

To improve Internet literacy, we call on people to consciously abide by Internet conventions, behave in a civilized manner, and avoid participating in or contributing to online violence. The application of innovative technologies has eliminated the root causes of cyber violence.










What Is Cyberbullying

Cyberbullying is bullying that takes place over digital devices like cell phones, computers, and tablets. Cyberbullying can occur through SMS, Text, and apps, or online in social media, forums, or gaming where people can view, participate in, or share content. Cyberbullying includes sending, posting, or sharing negative, harmful, false, or mean content about someone else. It can include sharing personal or private information about someone else causing embarrassment or humilia-tion. Some cyberbullying crosses the line into unlawful or criminal behavior.

The most common places where cyberbullying occurs are: Social Media, such as Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat, and Tik Tok Text messaging and messaging apps on mobile or tablet devices Instant messaging, direct messaging, and online chatting over the internet Online forums, chat rooms, and message boards, such as Reddit Email



In my secondary research, I watched books, stories and articles about cyberbullying, blogs and videos about dealing with cyberbullying. How to overcome cyberbullying, coping with cyberbullying, the effects of cyberbullying, bullying on social networks. Some people online post rumors, threats, sexual remarks, victims' personal information, or hate speech to harm others. More cyberbullying statistics are available, with more and more people experiencing cyberbullying, with around 55% of students saying they have experienced cyberbullying at some point in their lives. About 27% said they had been cyberbullied in the last 30 days. Cyberbullying by gender: 59.2% of girls vs. 49.5% of boys. In the study, questionnaires were sent to a global sample of secondary school students, high school students, university students, young people over 25 years of age, and middle-aged people between the ages of 10 and 35.

The layout of the graphic design directs the viewer's eye to navigate through anti-cyberbullying content that calls for support for victims of cyberbullying to help them or change some of the bullying behaviours some people engage in online. Simple yet impactful imagery is used and combined with bold, accessible typography. Intuitively represents the concept of words as weapons. Cyberbullying uses colours, typography, images, and layout in graphic design that designers can use to educate the public, promote empathy and encourage proactive action against cyberbullying.

The key to cyberbullying in graphic design has Colour plays a vital role in setting the tone of the message. In this poster, for example, dark red can be used to convey the seriousness of cyberbullying, while brighter colours can be used to draw attention or create a sense of hope and positivity. The choice in colour can affect the emotional response of the viewer and the retention of the message. The use of the colour red signifies that it will evoke a sense of danger or urgency, getting the viewer to pay attention and take action. Anti-cyberbullying in graphic design layout needs to be clear and easy to read to ensure that the text message is understood by all audience groups. 


Analysis


Hand: symbolises 'action'. Everyone in cyberspace can use to type and send messages. Taking action against cyberbullying is done through the hand. Report inappropriate content, support victims, and participate in creating a positive online culture. Hands can not only hurt but also help, educating people to think twice before posting content on the internet and motivating them to become positive online communicators. Don't cyberbully others.





Eyes: represents 'observation'. Observe irregularities in the online environment. The eye recognises cyberbullying. Symbolically, increased monitoring and awareness of online behaviours, especially in identifying possible bullying behaviours, can lead to more effective identification of and response to cyberbullying, thereby protecting individuals from it and contributing to the healthy development of the online environment.

Ear: represents 'listening'. Instead of listening to negative energy, ears need to listen to those affected by cyberbullying. Understanding their experiences, feelings and needs can help us better understand the impact of cyberbullying and provide the necessary support and assistance.




Insights & Ideation

Mouth: symbolises 'speech'. On the Internet, words are the primary means of communicating thoughts and feelings. We should avoid sending cyberbullying comments and educate and encourage people to use positive words to communicate. There is a need to raise awareness and preventive measures against verbal attacks so as to avoid harming others unintentionally. The power of the 'mouth', i.e. 'words', should be harnessed to reduce cyberbullying and create a more friendly and respectful online environment.






The words that come out of our mouths are powerful, inspiring, encouraging and motivating, but they can also be hurtful and destructive. The harm caused by words can be far-reaching and long-lasting, especially in an online environment where inappropriate words can spread quickly and affect a wider group. How to use graphic design to react to current cyberbullying situations to address them.



I first tried, a poster design (Figure 9) to convey a message of rejection of cyberbullying and to convey an anti-bullying message. Using facts and figures to show how widespread cyberbullying is, its effects and how victims can fight back. I intended to design images for social media as these platforms are often the scene of cyberbullying and teach people how to deal with it. I created four types of posters using the Chinese phrase 'Refuse Cyberbullying' to express the current phenomenon of cyberbullying. But it was a failure, the theme of the poster idea I wanted to make was not effective in helping people against cyberbullying, so I tried to make a second production, a pamphlet.Learn from the experience to think in terms of graphic design and how to make the work more empathetic. I want to transform and promote a healthier online culture through graphic design. Graphic design to mitigate the presence of cyberbullying and protect vulnerable individuals from cyberbullying online. Raising awareness of cyberbullying is important for the spread of cyberbullying. Advertising campaigns and graphic brochures can be used to educate people about what cyberbullying is and how to get help.

The design pamphlet conveys the message of cyberbullying to the audience through visual elements such as images, colours and typography, which can make complex concepts such as cyberbullying easier to understand.







Illustration, first attempt at making a brochure illustration design This is my production prototype, creating a preliminary draft design for the brochure, hand sketched. Drawing visual material that rejects cyberbullying and conveys an anti-bullying message through my design. At first the audience target for my brochure was for a younger audience, so I used a variety of bright colours which can be a little jarring when combined together.







The first time I created the initial draft design for the brochure, I needed to rework the colour palette because I was using a variety of bright colours that would be a bit jarring in combination. Just use 3 colours only, too many colours can look messy.





'Refusing Cyberbullying' is a nod to the theme, and this is how I designed the cover of the booklet, in black and red, to show the transition from the act of cyberbullying (the movement of the hands on the keyboard) to the result (the reaction of the victim), and to guide the viewer to understand the consistency and seriousness of the incident. Demonstrating the prevalence and social impact of cyberbullying, the design is not only visually appealing, but also has the function of conveying the message of rejecting cyberbullying.

Symbolises the fact that people are like puppets on strings in the cyber world and that the internet holds people's minds in check. Brown, black and red are used to convey the negative effects of cyberbullying, with red being used to emphasise harm and danger. The hand is designed like a scary or threatening imag to symbolise that cyberbullying is hidden underneath normal behaviour. These all people are linked to the hand movements to show the destructive power of cyberbullying words. The impact of cyberbullying anc society shows the people who are affected due to cyberbullying such as teenagers, adults, and children.










The damage cyberbullying does to people, as I researched the statements and words published by cyberbullying people, the damage cyberbullying does to people is far-reaching and multifaceted. The comments that are commonly used by bullies it not only affects the mental health of the victim, the victim is sad and upset and the world is a dark and black place. Cyber bullying text message after text message, trying to express rejection of cyber bullying, these words hurt people like a sharp weapon.



The second modification, the text message is converted into a red text background to emphasise the warning and danger, the character colour is converted from white to black, the black lines are converted into white lines, the red text background design is not only visually appealing, but at the same time it lets people know that cyber-bullying message conveys the harm brought to the people, and that the text is very painful for the people to be harmed as if they were injured and bleeding.



How do you make a cyberbully's typing and keyboarding hands express themselves artistically in graphic design?

The 'typing hands' of a cyberbully:

Abstract shapes and lines are used to convey the dynamics of the hands, and the tension of the colours and shapes to convey the emotional urgency and negative impact.











Grey, black and red are used to convey the negative effects of cyberbullying, and red can be used to emphasise harm and danger. The images are contrasted with light and dark, warm and cold colours to highlight the image of the hand and enhance the visual impact. Text is incorporated into the design, I incorporate torn or broken text effects into the design, these words can be a rejection of cyber bullying and the fragmentation of the font to show the destructive nature of its cyber bullying.

The meaning of the text is: Refusing

I have changed the original font colour from black to red, as red highlights the loneliness of the victim, and the aggressive behaviour of the bully. So I have adjusted the details of the design and the colour used is red. Effective visual communication of people resisting cyberbullying.

Uses: 'cyber violence' text to express, letter splicing and design. Smoking represents the stresses and worries of life, and the cigarette is held between the middle and index fingers, which is how most people smoke. The hand is in black and the text is in red.

The text 'Violent Internet' was used to convey the design. The hand holding a knife symbolises that words are like knives, knives are sharp and hurtful, and it lets people know that violence on the Internet is as sharp as knives and can hurt people, so we should reduce cyberbullying and not let words hurt people.



Recently, I've faced bullying on Twitter from two individuals. Despite asking them to stop and cutting off communication, they continue to harass me. It feels like I can't escape the situation on Twitter, no matter how much I try to ignore it. I've reported and blocked them, but I still feel helpless. Any suggestions would be appreciated.

Former friends who now bully me relentlessly call me names and send hurtful messages on Facebook. Learning about a boy who committed suicide due to bullying deeply upset me. I've tried to seek help from the principal, but he won't listen. I'm struggling to cope, desperate for it to end.

- 12 year-old girl from IL

For nearly four years, a younger student at my school has been consistently bullying me. Despite not provoking him, he relentlessly harasses me both in person and online. It's disheartening to endure such treatment from someone who should show respect. Recently, I finally blocked him after enduring his cruelty for so long. The constant bullying has taken a toll on my self-esteem and makes me feel frustrated and helpless, even though I'm older than him.

- 15 year-old boy from Muscat, Oman As I walked home from school, I received a threatening text accusing me of spreading rumors about someone's relationship. When I got home, I discovered it was false. Despite my efforts to confront the person, the threats continued until my cousin ended the relationship, stopping the harassment.

- 18 year-old girl from Victoria, Australia

My 15-year-old daughter faced cyberbullying when someone posted her picture with false and hurtful statements. It spread throughout the school, causing her distress, plummeting grades, and even illness. Despite our efforts, the school didn't effectively address the issue, leaving us frustrated and hurt. I had to transfer her to another school and change her phone number to protect her. As a parent, I felt angry, devastated, and lost, unable to shield her from the cruelty.



In the process of trying to modify the colors, the design colors of were re-modified, which was more in line with the theme of rejecting online violence, and the red color made the audience look more attractive. 
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


Graphic design plays an important role in raising awareness of cyberbullying. Words, images, colours and typography can evoke empathy in viewers and can touch people's emotions and engage them. The production of pamphlets evokes empathy for victims of cyberbullying, raises public awareness of the problem and reduces the number of cyberbullying cases. The dissemination of pamphlets this raises public awareness of the problem and reduces the number of cyberbullying cases. 

This will not only better spread the message of rejecting cyberbullying, but also increase public awareness and prevention of cyberbullying.
















USAGE METHOD














Buy materials to make models, put the products in the three-dimensional geometric space, and use labels to write down the words of cyberviolence, visually so that the audience can feel more clearly and intuitively and know the feelings of the person being cyberbullied, so as to reduce the harm caused by cyberbullying. Research some cyberbullying language on the Internet, write text on labels, and then use lines to connect the labels to the 3D hand model. The line represents the data cable of the network, and this line represents the network that connects people's lives. So that more viewers can understand the feelings brought by online violence.




The first time I wanted to make a plaster hand model, but I failed, so I started making a 3D model again. The model of the hand was designed according to the illustration in the booklet, and I used a combination of paper and rubber bands to make the model of the hand, and then glued it together.

Make 3D boxes, glue them together, and then make a three-dimensional space. I used some tags and pens to write down some text content about cyberbullying. These words are the key to online violence, because these words are like a knife that hurts the people who are being bullied online.













I thought about what materials to use to make a 3D hand model?


First of all, I need to make a 3D hand model. I can use clay or 3D printing to create a model of my hand. The first time I tried 3D printing, I tried using computer-aided design software to create a 3D model of my hand and then print it out. Then I tried to make it with plaster, which is the last product I made, I used hot melt adhesive adhesive, I used a hot melt glue gun to heat the hot melt stick, and waited for the hot melt adhesive to melt well. Then, apply the hot melt adhesive evenly over the space to be adhered to ensure that the subsequent adhesive is secure. Place the finished 3D hand mold on a space coated with hot melt adhesive. Wait for the hot melt adhesive to cool completely. Then glue together to create a 3D hand model that looks like the picture in the brochure.













Put the 3D model into the exhibition space, some thin red lines, connected to the labels, I use a pencil to write eye-catching text, the red line connects the hands and the label, representing the network cable on the Internet and the text of people's online violence, so that the work is more attractive to the audience.
















I placed the finished hand model in the exhibition space, and I tried different positions and angles and finally chose to place it this way. Using a thin red thread, wrap it around the various parts of the hand, fingers, and palms, so that the red thread forms a net-like structure. These red lines can represent the technical network, the usual network connection. I placed the designed labels in the display space so that the audience could clearly see and understand the meaning of the exhibits.

The placement and layout of the hand molds, red lines and labels are all designed and made by me to reject online violence. Exhibits and pamphlets seem to be more helpful for people to reject cyberbullying and reduce the harm of cyberbullying to people.







