






EXHIBITION DESIGN

• The challenge I confronted and resolved was how to create genuinely immersive and experiential spaces while respecting the venue's cultural heritage.



DESIGN CONCEPT

/Emotional Healing Space Design

My design philosophy centres on "Design Serving Function". Through gentle curved forms, the innate textures of natural materials, and minimalist yet practical functional elements, I create an inclusive, soothing space. This fosters a relaxed and unhurried atmosphere, enabling visitors to shed their defences from the moment they enter, experiencing acceptance, respect, and goodwill. Individuals continually engage in therapeutic activities, exhibition displays, and charity sales according to their needs. This journey evolves from the personal to the collective and societal, progressing from exchange and sharing to contributing to society through helping others. Participants gain self-affirmation and elevate their life's purpose, drawing healing strength to break through barriers and blossom anew.

Integration of Nature and Design

• Strategic windows and translucent partitions enhance internal-external connections, drawing in outdoor trees, lawns, and natural light. Corridor dividers offer visibility without direct confrontation, while earth-toned interiors cultivate a relaxed, welcoming ambience. Soft diffused lighting soothes anxiety, becoming an invisible healer.

Harmonious Flow and Transitions

• Eschewing straight lines and right angles, gentle curves guide visitors through functional zones. Thoughtfully designed transitional spaces, free from confinement or gloom, allow individuals to gradually lower their defences, facilitating a conscious shift from anxiety to relaxation.


Blending Privacy and Opennes

• Screens, glass, sheer fabrics, and movable partitions are artfully employed to safeguard the therapeutic privacy of functional zones while fostering an inclusive sense of community in rest areas. The outdoor space extends indoors through folding windows and corridors incorporating additional seating, dissolving the boundary between inside and outside. Solitude and shared moments coexist harmoniously here.





LEISURE AREA

• Movable partitions provide privacy while allowing light to pass through, and multiple seating areas are naturally formed. Soft, thick sofas and welcoming decorations give visitors a natural and welcoming feeling. • The sofa faces to window, offering a view of the scenery. This area truly serves as a corner where one can relax and engage in private conversations with friends.







• With large glass windows, light is diffused across the wooden walls and ceiling, creating a bright yet non-glaring atmosphere. The simple design, low-saturation colours, and soft diffused light help visitors relax and let their guard down.



DETAIL DISPLAY

- A curved semi-enclosed space is created facing the window, with a soft-padded sofa. The cloud-shaped sofa at the entrance reduces the distance to the entrance, enhancing a sense of separation and independence.
- Movable frosted glass partitions ensure that rest or personal affairs are not disturbed. They can also be moved as needed to change the size of the seating area.





HEALING TREE



DESIGN DESCRIPTION

- Healing tree is located in the centre of the indoor area, shaped like a large tree, rotating and extending to the ceiling.
- Firstly, it serves as a "Central Island"
 for traffic flow, with guide lines on
 the ground to direct and divert traffic.
 Secondly, it serves as a display platform,
 with a circular shelf at the bottom that
 can be used to display healing works.




• Furniture is arranged along the walls, with curved glass partitions and greenery placed along the corridor. The middle section of the partitions features a frosted surface to block the view.








INSTRUCTIONS



- The glass partitions and built-in glass cabinets on both sides not only make the functional rooms more transparent, but the sophisticated design also reduces eye contact between people and respects privacy.

 the scenery and feel nature.







INSTRUCTIONS

- High windows are installed to provide sufficient lighting while preventing operators from being distracted by outdoor activities.
- The wall behind the workbench features a DIY storage rack, allowing boxes of any size to be hung at any position on the perforated panel. This design facilitates easy access and adapts to different operational requirements.
- The colours used are warm and gentle tones, while the furniture colours are relatively more saturated, enriching the space.






ADULT PSYCHOTHERAPY ROOM —— CHILDREN'S PSYCHOTHERAPY ROOM





 The adult psychotherapy room is simply and neatly decorated to reflect a professional image. The light green walls and furniture in a uniform colour scheme help patients feel at ease.





• The children's psychotherapy room features tables and chairs designed with soft-padded modules to increase friendliness and promote interaction and communication.



CORRIDOR

• The spatial circulation employs a seamless transitional logic, avoiding any sense of oppression or fragmentation. This allows users to gradually relax during their movement, facilitating a psychological shift from anxiety to tranquillity.



ENTRANCE & WAITING AREA

• The layout is simple and minimalist, eschewing unnecessary decorations. The focus is on the inherent texture of the materials, natural light and shadow, creating a sense of calm and relaxation through negative space.


